Dear Ms. Duenas:

As requested by the Bureau of Budget & Management Research (BBMR) and the Civilian Military Task Force (CMTF) on April 1, 2008, the Judiciary is respectfully requesting approximately \$21 million in federal funding to design, construct and to fully operate a newly constructed, Northern Court Facility, which will accommodate at least three (3) Judges, one (1) Magistrate and corresponding support personnel. It should be duly noted from the onset that these requested funds for the construction, positions and collateral equipment are directly attributable to the pre-buildup needs under the Fiscal Year 2010 Military Buildup Budget Call Request.

Accordingly, we have factored in the judicial challenges concerning the impact of thousands of military personnel and their dependents, the additional federal workers and their families, imported foreign H2 workers, expanded civilian entrepreneurs/businesses, and the ever-increasing local population growth on our judicial system through attaching: the Judiciary's Cumulative Budget Request for FY2010 pre-buildup needs, including our: Project Description, Project Cost Estimates, and Project Timelines, as well as, a proposed design-concept for a New Northern Court Facility, which we believe should be ideally situated in a northern population center to service heavily populated residential areas, and to service near planned military residential areas.

The requested construction for a new court facility is absolutely a key factor in meeting the FY2010 pre-buildup needs, in that our current Judicial Center has met its near maximum capacity in meeting the everyday operational needs of our diverse island community, and that the requested addition of judicial officers and support personnel and needed equipment will not be feasible unless a new facility is first constructed.


In fact, Chief Justice, Robert J. Torres Jr., represented in his May 1, 2008 State of the Judiciary speech Courthouse space is a significant issue for the Judiciary. The unprecedented military buildup will place a demand on courthouse facilities that the Judiciary has not see before and access to justice cannot be adequately met by existing judicial resources and facilities, during the impending pre-buildup.

The military buildup will certainly lead to an increase to the volume of cases, crowded physical conditions, and a greater number of people present within the Judiciary. The strains of our system will be compounded by a lack of adequate working space and crowded parking facilities, which only increases the imperative need for a more permanent solution, such as: a newly constructed Northern Court Facility to address the Judiciary's pre-buildup needs for Guam's overall public safety needs. We need to have the facility built during the pre-build up era in order to provide necessary services in the latter expansion years.

As one branch of government that facilitates criminal justice and enforces all private and public/commercial contracts, the Judicial Branch of Guam is appreciative for the opportunity to participate in this one-time budget call request for pre-buildup needs, in order to improve and increase access to the courts and to ensure the delivery of court services for all who presently live here or who may reside here in the near future.

**Statement of Need**

**Program / Project Name: New Northern Court Facility Construction Project**

**Program / Project Cost: \$21,048,310.00 Million for FY 2010 Military Pre-Buildup Budget Call**

**Program / Project Description:**

**Introduction:**

As requested by the Bureau of Budget and Management Research and the Civilian Military Task Force on Tuesday, April 1, 2008, attached is the Judiciary of Guam's one-time FY 2010 requested budget for the: **Military Buildup Budget Call** and pre-buildup needs to accommodate the expansion of military forces on Guam based upon an anticipated increase in population. This master plan and corresponding budget is our estimate of what it would take to ensure efficient and effective access to judicial services that are provided to all sectors of our community.

The demands on the government's infrastructure, as well as judicial services provided to the civilian and military community must be addressed in order to meet the anticipated population increase.

The Judiciary's budget plan addresses relevant issues associated with the impending military build-up; addresses the positive and negative impacts; identifies immediate and long term issues; analyzes infrastructure needs; examines the necessary resources to address future concerns; and evaluates personnel requirements to meet these demands over the next several years.

All of these specific issues highlighted above were thoroughly reviewed, analyzed and collectively evaluated by the Judiciary's workgroup, which was composed of division heads and support staff of the Judiciary of Guam. The workgroup was comprised of the following divisions: (1). Courts and Ministerial Division; (2). Probation Services Division; (3). Marshal Services Division; (4). Client Services and Family Counseling Division; (5). Procurement and Facilities Management Division, and (6). Financial Management Division.

For the record, a 2006 judicial work-load study conducted by the National Center for State Courts (NCSC) determined that the Judiciary needs additional full time judicial officers to complement the seven (7) trial court judges, referees and hearing officers in order to handle the Judiciary's current caseload.

The NCSC study did not include the anticipated increase of military presence on Guam, including the population increase during pre- build up. The military buildup only reinforces the Judiciary's need for additional officers, and we believe there will be a need for at least three (3) additional judges, one (1) magistrate judge, corresponding support personnel, resources, and new court facilities, in order to effectively meet the future population growth and demand for expanded court services during the impending buildup.

Accordingly, our workgroup developed a pre-buildup budget based on our needs assessment, which in our professional experience meets the Judiciary's specific requirements, to include the new construction of a Northern Court Facility. The proposed court building will alleviate overcrowding at the existing Guam Judicial Center, and also targets the anticipated population growth in northern Guam and expected military concentration in the area.

Moreover, attached is a proposed design/concept for a new courthouse, including a finalized budget breakdown representing all of the budget object categories necessary to meet the projected costs for the architectural and engineering design services, consultant services, construction management services, land acquisition, and the actual construction costs for the Northern Court Facility.

Furthermore, this budget request also covers the overall detailed costs associated with: personnel, utilities, contractual(s), furniture, equipment, vehicles, supplies and materials, including computers and/or technology related costs, such as communications and networking infrastructure.

**SUMMARY**

In order for the Judiciary of Guam to meet the anticipated military buildup and local population increase, it will cost an estimated \$21,048,310 to design, construct, and to manage a fully operational Northern Court Facility.

Our workgroup, after analyzing the positive and negative aspects of the military buildup; identifying the immediate and long term issues; determining our infrastructure needs; examining the necessary resources to address future concerns; and after evaluating the personnel requirements, have collectively determined that three (3) Judges and one (1) Magistrate Judge, along with support personnel, are necessary, including the planned capital improvement project or construction of a new northern courthouse to meet the future demands placed upon judicial services.

As per our review, the workgroup developed a cumulative budget, which entails approximate costs which are based on the current market value for the architectural and engineering (A&E) design services, land acquisition, construction management, consultant services, and construction costs for a new 40,406 square-foot court building. Our proposed design lay-out is conservatively one-third the actual size or scale of the Guam Judicial Center, and is still subject to further specifications, requirements and functional analysis, which will cost approximately \$12,247,560 to construct.

Additionally, this new court building and related budget will accommodate the required costs for one hundred and twenty-three (123) personnel, utilities, equipment, furniture, technology, network infrastructure, communications needs, multiple services and/or contractual agreements, capital outlay for vehicles, miscellaneous costs, and supplies and materials to fully operate the Northern Court Facility. These delineated costs, excluding the courthouse, totaled approximately \$8,800,750 in needed funding.

It should be noted that a majority of the above cost structures were based on certain percentages (e.g., 30%-50%-100%, depending on the object category or specific item or service) from our previous Fiscal Year 2009 budget, and served as our baseline for cost estimate purposes.

In closing, we are confident that our request for \$21,048,310.00 in funding will allow the Judiciary of Guam to build a new courthouse in the northern area, fully fund personnel and operational expenses, and provide for an anticipated growth of needed judicial services for Guam based on the projected military buildup and corresponding growth of our local population over the next several years.

**Program / Project Objective:**

(1). To secure Federal funding in the amount of: \$21,048,310.00 from the United States Congress, to support the civilian and military population growth by constructing a Northern Court Facility, fully funding personnel and operational expenses, to increase accessibility to the courts, and to ensure the delivery of court services, from the initial filing, to their final disposition or adjudication, for all court-hearings involving the following case-categories: Criminal Felony Cases, Criminal Misdemeanor Cases, Domestic Cases, Juvenile Division (i.e., Delinquency) Cases, Juvenile Special Proceedings, Civil Cases, Child Support Cases, Adoption Cases, Land Registration Cases, Probate Cases, Small Claims Cases, Last Will and Testament Cases, Special Proceedings(Marriage filings) Cases, Traffic Citation Cases, and Non-Traffic Citation Cases.

**Project Cost Estimate and Project Timeline:**

The total estimated cost (just for the construction alone) for a new court facility is: \$7,071,050. There are two components within the total cost. Initial capital outlay cost which includes but is not limited to land acquisition, project consultants, architectural & engineering services, construction management services, construction services and initial outfitting of furniture and equipment in the new court facility.

Estimated initial capital outlay cost is: \$14,547,846. Then there are the costs associated with daily operations of the judicial facility, commonly referred to as recurring cost or operational cost. The recurring/operational cost is estimated to be: \$6,500,464.

The proposed new court facility is a long lead time undertaking. To acquire property without litigation could take six (6) months to one (1) year.

If Government property is available for the project, the land acquisition period could be greatly reduced. To design and award a contract to construct the new court building could take eight (8) months to one (1) year. Construction could take one year to 1½ years. Time-line planning show that the initial phase of constructing a new court facility should begin in mid 2008, to as late as mid 2009, in order to coincide with the initial arrival of the military buildup in 2012.
